

First Lesson Isaiah 9:2-7

Isaiah promises joy among the people, for Messiah, the Light of the world, is come to establish His Kingdom forever.

R The first lesson is from the ninth chapter of Isaiah.


The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined. You have multiplied the nation; you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as they are glad when they divide the spoil.

For the yoke of his burden, and the staff for his shoulder, the rod of his oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For every boot of the tramping warrior in battle tumult and every garment rolled in blood will be burned as fuel for the fire.

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this. *ESV*

Micah prophesies the Promised Ruler will be born in Bethlehem.


R The second lesson is from the fifth chapter of Micah.

Third Lesson Luke 1:26-35


Luke foretells the birth of Jesus.

R The third lesson is from the first chapter of Luke.

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High.

And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?" And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God." *ESV*

Fourth Lesson John 3:16-21

John writes the reason for Jesus' coming.

R The fourth lesson is from the third chapter of John.

[Jesus said:] "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.


For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their deeds were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed. But whoever does what is true comes to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that his deeds have been carried out in God."

Processional Hymn




To symbolize the unity we share in Christ and His centrality in our lives, the Gospel will be read from the middle of the congregation

Fifth Lesson Luke 2:1-20 (KJV)

The Christmas Gospel narrates the birth of our Savior.

- P The fifth lesson is from the second chapter of Luke.
- C Glory to You, O Lord.
- ¹ And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be taxed.
- ²(And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria.)
- ³ And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city.
- ⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judaea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:)
- ⁵To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child.
- ⁶ And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered.
- ⁷ And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn.
- ⁸ And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night.
- ⁹ And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid.

- ¹⁰ And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people.
- ¹¹ For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord.
- ¹² And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger.
- ¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying,
- ¹⁴Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men.
- ¹⁵ And it came to pass, as the angels were gone away from them into heaven, the shepherds said one to another, Let us now go even unto Bethlehem, and see this thing which is come to pass, which the Lord hath made known unto us.
- ¹⁶ And they came with haste, and found Mary, and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger.
- ¹⁷ And when they had seen it, they made known abroad the saying which was told them concerning this child.
- ¹⁸ And all they that heard it wondered at those things which were told them by the shepherds.
- ¹⁹ But Mary kept all these things, and pondered them in her heart.
- ²⁰ And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told unto them.

- C Praise to You, O Christ.


