

For baptized Christians (Matthew 28:19) who have been instructed in the faith (Galatians 6:6), The Lord's Supper is our participation in the body and blood of Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 10:16), as the one body of Christ (1 Corinthians 10:17), to receive forgiveness of sin (Matthew 26:28) and to proclaim the Lord's death until He comes (1 Corinthians 11:26).



- Do you believe that the body and blood of Jesus are present in, with and under the bread and wine?
- Do you seek to lead godly lives by the power of the Holy Spirit?


C: We welcome Him, our Savior and our God.

- **P:** Joy to the World! See how the Father has loved us.
- C: We are God's children, and that's what we are!
- **P:** Joy to the world! God has shown His love and has come to bring salvation to all people.

Confession and Forgiveness

- P: Sisters and brothers in Christ: there was a time when the world sat in darkness, separated from God because of sin. Since we human beings were unable to find God in that darkness, He came near to us as a baby, born of a virgin, bringing with Him the great light of our salvation. I encourage you to come near to God, open your hearts to Him, and confess to Him your sins. (Silence for personal reflection and confession.)
- **P:** Heavenly Father,
- All: we confess that we have sinned against You in our thoughts, words, and deeds. The world has tempted us in this Christmas season to put our delight and joy in material things, to be envious of others, and to center our celebrations around ourselves rather than on you. Thus we have sinned against You and against one another.
- **P:** The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit, a broke and contrite heart. O God, You will not despise. Psalm 51:17
- All: The celebration You desire is the worship of the heart. Forgive our sins, O Lord, for the sake of the Babe of Bethlehem, Jesus Christ, who died for us. Decorate our hearts with repentance and joy that our Christmas celebration may be pleasing to You.
- **P:** This Child whose birth we celebrate came among us to live perfectly in our stead, to give His life in payment for our sins, to rise from the grave for our justification, and to give us new life. In His name and at His command, I as a called and ordained servant of the Word, forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Isaiah 62: 10-12

C: Thanks be to God.


Epistle Reading.

Titus 3:4-7

R: The Epistle is from the third chapter of Titus.

But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

- **R:** This is the Word of the Lord.
- C: Thanks be to God.



The Family Reading of the Christmas Gospel

Luke 2:1-20

P: The Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke, the second chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord

Fathers: In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria.

Mothers: And all went to be registered, each to his own town.

Fathers: And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child.

Mothers: And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Fathers and Boys: And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night.

Mothers and Girls:

And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

All: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"

Fathers and Boys: When the angels went away from them into heaven, the

shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them.

Mothers: But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart.

Fathers: And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had

heard and seen, as it had been told them.

C: Praise to you, O Christ

Sermon Text: Luke 1:26-38

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed^[] to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?"

And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God. And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

The Christmas Confession of Faith

I believe in the Holy Spirit, who has brought me to faith in the Christ of Christmas and by whose continuous work in my heart, I am ever led to lay before the feet of Christ, the treasures of my love and live under Him as my King, both now and forever. Amen.

Comfort the lonely with Your presence, by your gracious power in keeping with Your will grant healing to the sick. Especially we remember before You..., for whom our prayers are requested. We pray that those whose hearts are burdened with memories of loved ones who are no longer present to celebrate with us this year may find peace and hope in the message of Your love. Watch over, bless, and protect all who serve and protect us as we worship: our armed forces, police forces,

firefighters, medical professionals and others. Grant them joy in their work, and give them peace. Lord, in Your mercy,

- P: We pray for Your blessing on all who will receive the gift of life through the blessed Sacrament of Your Son's body and blood this day. May our eating and drinking work in us a sense of peace, forgiveness, life, and salvation as You intend. Strengthen our faith, that we may honor You in all we do, and call all people to receive the gift of life through Your Son. Lord, in Your mercy,



- C: To Father, Son and Spirit, eternal one-in-three, be thanks and praise through all our days and to eternity!


