### The Service of the Tenebrae

This service is an adaptation of the ancient Tenebrae service dating from the 8th century. It commemorates the suffering and death of Christ. The literal translation of the Latin word "Tenebrae" is "shadows." In more recent years it has been presented as a service progressing from light to darkness. As the candles are extinguished, they symbolize the fading loyalty of the disciples and friends of Jesus. It also portrays the fading light of the world as Christ was departing from it.

Seven candles are used. They are extinguished one by one as the service progresses. The lights in the nave and chancel are also dimmed step by step.

At the end of the service one candle remains lit but it is taken from view. Then it is restored to sight reminding us that even though Christ lay in His tomb, He rose on the third day.

There is no benediction to conclude the service. The omission of the benediction at the end of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday liturgies indicate their continuity with each other and with the celebration of the Resurrection.

When the service has concluded, please leave the building in silence.

#### Series Theme

"Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29) That was John the Baptist's powerful witness to Jesus at the Jordan River when the Savior came to be baptized by him. The image of a lamb is used frequently in both the Old and New Testaments to describe the Messiah as well as the sinful people He came to save. This Lenten season we gather to examine and to meditate on some of these Biblical pictures of...

### Good Friday "The Lamb for Daily Sacrifice"

Despite man's best efforts, even those of God's Christians, we all sin much and we sin daily. God required a daily sacrifice for Israel's sin so His people would have a daily reminder of their need and His great mercy. Daily sacrifice. It was a twice a day, day after day, 365 days per year thing. Then Jesus came and changed all that on one momentous day we call "Good Friday." Today we remember and give God thanks for that once-for-all sacrifice of the Lamb of God in our place.

#### **Invocation and Confession of Sins**

P In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit

We mourn and struggle to understand the depth of Christ's love - that He should suffer and die in our place. Father, our hearts are heavy as we gather in the name of Christ, bearing witness to the terror of His crucifixion, knowing full well that we are guilty sinners, in need of Your forgiveness, life, and salvation.

All: Christ, our Savior has died for our sins.

P At times, we have failed to strive against evil in the world.

All: Christ, our Savior has died for our sins.

P At times, we have denied our Lord.

All: Christ, our Savior has died for our sins.

P At times we have betrayed our Lord.

All: Christ, our Savior has died for our sins. Have mercy on us Lord and grant us forgiveness. Amen.





### "The Lambs for Daily Sacrifice" Exodus 29:38-46

"Now this is what you shall offer on the altar: two lambs a year old, day by day regularly. One lamb you shall offer in the morning, and the other lamb you shall offer at twilight. And with the first lamb a tenth seah of fine flour mingled with a fourth of a hin of beaten oil, and a fourth of a hin of wine for a drink offering. The other lamb you shall offer at twilight, and shall offer with it a grain offering and its drink offering, as in the morning, for a pleasing aroma, a food offering to the LORD. It shall be a regular burnt offering throughout your generations at the entrance of the tent of meeting before the LORD, where I will meet with you, to speak to you there. There I will meet with the people of Israel, and it shall be sanctified by my glory. I will consecrate the tent of meeting and the altar. Aaron also and his sons I will consecrate to serve me as priests. I will dwell among the people of Israel and will be their God. And they shall know that I am the LORD their God, who brought them out of the land of Egypt that I might dwell among them. I am the LORD their God.

### Introduction

Today we would like to turn back time to that first Good Friday to try to relive, in a brief devotion, the emotions that those who lived it once must have had. Recall in spirit how, as the sun climbed toward its zenith that morning, they had fastened Him to the Cross with great nails. It was nine o'clock a.m. At mid-day darkness covered the earth. At three o'clock He yielded up His spirit. Then Joseph and Nicodemus begged His lifeless body from Pontius Pilate. Quickly they took it down from the cross, and carefully laid it to rest in the unused tomb. A watch was established, the Roman seal set on the great stone. "It is finished." "O sorrow dread, God's Son is dead!"

P God has not spared His own Son. (Romans 8:32a)

C But delivered Him up for us all (Roman8:32b)


### Darkness of Man's Betrayal


Lesson Matthew 26:47-50

"Judas, do you betray, the Son of Man with a kiss?" The tragic events of that night began in terms of men, with Judas of Kerioth. Judas was one of the twelve and, in his twisted mind, the Miracle-worker could free Himself. So for thirty pieces of silver, the price of a slave, Jesus was made available to His captors.

Now Jesus is becoming the outcast One. Men have begun to turn on Him. Among men, one of the special pupils gave Him into the hands of the enemy. Is there a greater tragedy in life than to have one, whom one has loved, turn to oppose?

- P He is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so He opened not His mouth. He was cut off out of the land of the living; for the transgressions of my people was He stricken. (Isaiah 53:7, 8)
- C He has poured out His soul unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors. For transgression of my people was He stricken. (Isaiah 53:8.12)

### Darkness of Friends' Desertion


Lesson Matthew 26:51-56


"Peter said to Him; 'Even if I must die with You, I will not deny You.' And so said all the disciples." That's what we read His closest friends vowing in the Upper Room. How soon they forgot that, just an hour or two later in Gethsemane. We are embarrassed by their miserable failure.

HOWEVER - on the day of our confirmation we too vowed "to remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, even to death." Remember? How faithful have we been? Did not Christ die for all of our denials and desertions of Him?

- P Then Jesus said to them, "You will all fall away because of Me this night; for it is written 'I will strike the Shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered." (Matthew 26:31)
- C All we like sheep have gone astray...and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all. (Isaiah 53:6)


# Darkness of the Church's Rejection

Lesson Matthew 26:62-68

Then His chosen Church rejected Him. Caiaphas, the High Priest, rose and tearing His garments, cried out, "This man has blasphemed God!" His Church made this accusation against Him.

Can you feel the heartbreak of this? He as God, had nourished, blessed, corrected, helped His Church, against countless enemies. Into her keeping He had placed the sacred trust of the promised Messiah. Now that the Messiah had come, she cries out against Him, "This man has blasphemed God," and makes her preparation to have Him put to death.

- P Lament like a Virgin, O my people: Howl you shepherds, in ashes and sackcloth; for the great and terrible day of the Lord comes. (Joel 1:8, Jeremiah 25:34, Joel 1:15)
- C Gird yourselves, and lament, you priests, howl, you ministers of the altar. Come lie all night in sackcloth. (Joel 1:13)


# Darkness of your Nation's Rejection

Luke 23:6-11

Herod would have none of Him. Herod represented "the chosen people," the Jews, being their nominal head. But Herod mocked Him - sent Him back to Pilate.

Has your nation ever declared you an outlaw to it? Are you a man without a country? When you try to feel the awful pangs of the man who has no home, you begin to feel what He felt that night.

- P Arise, O Jerusalem, put off your garments of joy; cast up dust upon your head and gird yourself with sackcloth.
- C For in these has been slain the Savior of Israel.

## Darkness of the World's Rejection

Luke 23:20-24

Pilate washed his hands of Him. He knew Him to be innocent, but he delivered Him to be crucified.


### Pilate! - - The World!

The last human straw to which He could cling, the final friend to whom He could turn, His last chance of appeal and it is gone.

Now only the Way of Sorrows lies before Him. The Way of Sorrows - the heavy cross, the wailing women, the taunting multitude, the bitter wine, the thorns, the nails, now only the cross.

- P He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief. (Isaiah 53:3a)
- C And as one from whom men hide their faces He was despised, and we esteemed Him not. (Isaiah 53:3b)

# **Darkness of God's Rejection**


Lesson Matthew 27:45-46

Only once has it happened in all the history of man. Only once has God forsaken a man, and that man was He.

Try, but you cannot imagine what it means to be forsaken of God, for lo, He is with you always, even unto the end of the world.

That's why that cry from the cross is such an agonizing cry. This was the final depth to which He could go that day in which He was our substitute in death.

- P My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue cleaved to my jaws, and You have brought me into the dust of death. (Psalms 22:15)
- C But be not far from Me, Lord; O my strength, hasten to help Me. (Psalms 22:19)





Then, when He had cried with a loud voice. He bowed His weary head and yielded up His Spirit. Forsaken of man and God in His supreme sacrifice, for God and for man, He died. And when the soldiers came, they pierced His side, and forthwith came out blood and water.

- P I am counted as one of them that fall down into the pit; And I have been even as a man that has no strength; free among the dead. (Psalm 88:4)
- C You laid me in the lowest pit; In a place of darkness, and in the deep, and I have been even as a man that has no strength. (Psalm 88:6)



- P Christ became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. (Philippians 2:8)
